Dear Parents/Carers

What a whirlwind year.

The children and young people here have continued to wow us with their learning. We have really focused on phonics this year, and the results have been seen across the school, with children's reading abilities improving above our average. Another area of focus for us was collaboration. We wanted to be part of the wider community, more so than we are already. Mr Vickery, our careers lead, has done a fantastic job of organising business events, careers weeks, getting more local businesses on board with us, and opening up a wider range of employment opportunities for our youngsters. If any parents out there can offer our pupils work experiences or employment after Sixth Form please contact Mr Vickery. We have also joined the **Compass collaboration group**, which is a group of schools in Swindon who share training opportunities, knowledge and expertise, events, and peer reviewing processes. We are continuing with this next year.

In terms of trips, pupils have visited Pencelli for residential, along with Stoke Mandeville sports event, Legge House residential for primary, and various other outings. The Duke of Edinburgh participants have successfully achieved bronze and silver awards. There was some disruption from the teacher strikes, but they can catch up next year. Our music festival was also cancelled but again we shall try to run it next year.

We said goodbye to six year 11 pupils who are moving on to college courses, and twenty Sixth Form pupils moving into work or college, with a few going to Horizons specialist college. At the time of writing we are still waiting to have confirmation of the college site for use by our Sixth Formers. All being agreed, this is an exciting venture for us, as many of our youngsters go on to college courses.

Huge thanks to the staff here who work tirelessly to ensure that your children get a great education and all of the opportunities that mainstream children have, and more!

Next year the focus will be on communication skills, developing the college site (assuming it can go ahead), and reading.

In our topic on animals the children examined habitats and what living things need in order to survive. They looked after the animals on the farm, taking part in grooming them or feeding them as part of the timetable curriculum. In our artwork the children used a range of techniques and media to create pictures, sculptures and collages. The children enjoyed planting seeds and watching our beans grow from a seed to a fully developed plant and recorded this in a photographic diary. Once the seedlings were large enough, we planted them in our outdoor garden area. In our science we have been examining the weather and created our own rain gauges, as well as identifying which weather is best for growing plants.

The children have also enjoyed athletics and the outdoor gym, as well as cooking a variety of sweet and savoury dishes. Each week the children have enjoyed music lessons with Mr Marvell. Everyone particularly enjoyed Science week when each child made a boat and then tested it's ability to float and carry a cargo.
